May 16-19 • NCAA Regional I • Columbia, SC (South Carolina, Host)

UCLA, the top-seeded team in the 2002 NCAA Softball Championship, will open its postseason schedule on Thursday, May 16, in Columbia, South Carolina. UCLA, the automatic qualifier from the Pac-10, will open against sixth-seeded Liberty on Thursday, a team UCLA has never faced. Other teams in the NCAA's top-seeded regional include #2 Georgia (SEC Tournament runner-up; has never faced UCLA), #3 South Carolina (host, SEC East Division Champion, UCLA has 8-0 record vs. USC), #4 Eastern Kentucky (Play-in winner, UCLA has never faced EKU), and #5 UMBC (Play-in winner, UCLA has never faced Maryland-Baltimore County).

BRUINS WIN SEVENTH PAC-10 TITLE WITH WEEKEND SWEEP

With final-weekend victories over Arizona (4-2 on Friday) and Arizona State (4-1 and 6-1 on Saturday), the Bruins finished their Pac-10 slate with an 18-3 record to clinch UCLA's seventh Pac-10 Championship. UCLA's most recent Pac-10 title came in 1999, when the Bruins went on to win the NCAA Championship. Other Pac-10 titles were in 1988, 89, 90, 91 and 93.

Friday's game began on a rough note for UCLA, as Arizona's Lovieanne Jung put the first pitch of the game over the right field fence, giving the Cats a 1-0 lead. UCLA would come back in the third inning, when **Natasha Watley** posted a lead-off triple followed by an RBI single from **Tairia Mims**. **Stacey Nuve**man then followed with a towering home run, the 88th of her career, and third in as many at-bats against Wildcat star Jennie Finch. UCLA went on to win by a 4-2 margin.

The Bruins learned between games of Saturday's doubleheader that they had clinched sole possession of the Pac-10 title, but that did not slow the UCLA offense. The Bruins had two home runs in the opening game of the day, from Mims and **Stephanie Ramos**, and a grand slam in the first inning of game two from **Claire Sua**.

STACEY NUVEMAN NAMED PAC-10 ATHLETE OF THE YEAR

The Pac-10's annual awards were announced on Monday, and Bruin senior slugger **Stacey Nuve**man was named the Pac-10's Athlete of the Year for the third time in her career. She is the third player to earn three Pac-10 Player of the Year honors, joining UCLA greats Lisa Longaker (1987-88-90) and Lisa Fernandez (1991-93). Nuve

The Amateur Softball Association, the National Governing Body of Softball in the United States, has announced the ten finalists for the inaugural USA Softball Collegiate Player of the Year Award. The initial list of 25 finalists was announced on April 12. This award is designed to recognize outstanding athletic achievement by female collegiate softball players across the country.

Three Bruins, senior catcher **Stacey Nuve**man, junior shortstop **Natasha Watley** and sophomore pitcher **Keira Goerl** are among the list of 10 finalists. No other school has more than one player on the list of 10 finalists.

Three finalists will be announced May 31st, with the winner of the 2002 USA Softball Collegiate Player of the Year Award being announced June 7th.

Playing in NCAA Regionals

HEAD COACH SUE ENQUIST

The 2002 season marks Sue Enquist's 14th campaign as head coach of the Bruin softball program. It is her 23rd year as part of UCLA's softball coaching staff and her 27th year of involvement with the program as either a coach or player. Enquist has a **691-127-1 (.844)** coaching record and 1,118 wins in her Bruin softball career as a player, assistant coach and head coach, combined. As a player from 1975-78, Enquist became UCLA's first All-American while establishing the Bruin career batting average record of .401. She is still the only UCLA player to complete her career with a batting average over .400, although this will change by the end of the season (Stacey Nuveman).

FREED TIES UCLA CAREER WINS RECORD

Senior **Amanda Freed** tied former Bruin B'Ann Burns (1994-97) for the UCLA career pitching victories record, earning her 96th win on Saturday against Arizona State. She passed current assistant coach **Lisa Fernandez** with her 13-2 win over Stanford on April 27. Freed is also sprinting up the UCLA lists for appearances (123, second to Burns), innings pitched (740.1, second) and strikeouts (735, fourth). With her eight-K performance on April 6 at Arizona, Freed became the fourth player in Bruin softball history to record 700 career strikeouts.

Offensively, her career credits are equally impressive. Freed, a member of UCLA's career .300 club (.328 career average entering postseason), has taken over the UCLA record for career at-bats with 792, and is second to teammate Natasha Watley for the UCLA record for career runs scored with 180. She is also second to Watley in career stolen bases with 51. Freed is ranked in doubles (49, t2nd), triples (11, t4th), hits (260, 5th) and RBI (97, 18th).

BUCK BECOMES VALUABLE UTILITY PLAYER

UCLA's starting shortstop on the 1999 NCAA Championship team, senior **Crissy Buck** continues to spend her time in the Bruin lineup, but has become more of a utility player for head coach Sue Enquist. She is one of five Bruins (Nuveman, Watley, Freed, Mims) to start all 56 games this season.

During the 2002 season, Buck has recorded 27 starts in right field, 19 at third base, five at second base, four in center field and one at designated player. She also played a partial game at shortstop, the only player other than Watley to field the position this season.

WATLEY STREAKS, HITS INTO RECORD BOOKS

With three stolen bases in game one against Purdue on March 2, junior All-America shortstop **Natasha Watley** became the first Bruin in history to record 100 stolen bases in her UCLA career. Watley currently has 121 career swipes, and is fourth on the Pac-10's career list. Arizona's Vivian Holm is third with 129 stolen bases. Watley also holds UCLA's career runs scored record with 181.

Also notable this season, Watley surpassed the 100 hit plateau on May 11, becoming the first Bruin to record two seasons with 100+ hits. She has also posted an impressive hitting streak, having hit safely in UCLA's first 29 games during the 2002 season. With a 1-for-3 performance in last May's NCAA Championship game, Watley now has two hitting streaks of 30 or more games in as many seasons. She recorded a Pac-10 record 32-game streak a year ago (March 2-May 2). Last year's streak is tied for the fifth-longest in on the NCAA Division I list, while the 2002 version is tied for seventh-best in NCAA history.

ELEVEN BRUINS INVITED TO USA SOFTBALL SELECTION CAMP

Five current and two former UCLA softball players were chosen by USA Softball as members of its 22-player core group of athletes to move on to its upcoming World Championships camp in May/June 2002 that was named in January. Current players include **Toria Auelua**, **Amanda Freed**, **Stacey Nuveman**, **Tairia Mims** and **Natasha Watley**, while volunteer assistant coach **Lisa Fernandez** and 2001 senior Courtney Dale round out the Bruin contingent. Two additional former Bruins, Lyndsey Klein and Sheila (Cornell) Douty, were added to the list of invitees at the end of March. USA Softball will be going for its fifth consecutive World Championship at the 2002 ISF World Championships in July in Saskatoon, Canada. The U.S. is looking to qualify as the top seed for a third consecutive Olympic Games after winning Gold in 1996 (Atlanta) and 2000 (Sydney).

When USA Softball expanded its invitation list for the World Championship selection camp on May 1, two additional Bruins were added to the group in sophomores Keira Goerl and Claire Sua.

UCLA has more current or former players among this 60-player group (11) than any other school. The team camp will take place May 30-June 3 at the ARCO Olympic Training Center in Chula Vista, CA.

GOERL SETS PAC-10 RECORD WITH FIFTH WEEKLY HONOR

Keira Goerl, a first-team All-Pac-10 selection, has earned a conference record five Pac-10 Pitcher of the Week honors in 2002, becoming the first player in Pac-10 history to earn five weekly honors during a single season. Only one other Bruin, Lisa Fernandez (1993), had been a four-time honoree.

Goerl (pronounced like "Carol") has become the workhorse of the UCLA staff, and has capitalized on the opportunity this season. She enters postseason play with 11 double-figure strikeout games to her credit, with a season-high 13 K's coming on Feb. 20 vs. UC Riverside and on Apr. 24 vs. Washington. Goerl, who leads the Pac-10 in ERA and opposing batting average, has thrown double-figure strikeout games in five of her last eight appearances, which include a no-hitter on April 26 at then-No. 6 California, a one-hit shutout with 12 strikeouts on May 5, at Oregon State and a 12-K performance on May 10 against No. 2 Arizona.

The no-hitter against Cal was the fifth no-hitter of the season for Goerl, the most by a Bruin in a single season since Dee Dee Weiman tossed five during the 1994 season.

2002: YEAR OF THE BRUIN NO-HITTER?

With **Keira Goerl's** no-hitter against No. 6 California on April 2, the Bruin pitching staff has combined for seven no-hitters, the highest total for a Bruin squad since Dee Dee Weiman and B'Ann Burns combined for 10 no-nos during the 1994 season. So far this year, sophomore **Keira Goerl** has posted five no-hitters, while senior **Amanda Freed** has two. In 1994, Weiman had five no-hitters, Burns had three, and two no-hitters were shared between the two pitchers. Goerl is the first Pac-10 pitcher with five solo no-hitters in a season since Weiman in 1994.

THROW SOME GROUND BALLS, THEY'RE MORE DEMOCRATIC

As Crash Davis said to Nuke La Loosh in the movie *Bull Durham*, "Strikeouts are boring, besides that, they're fascist. Throw some ground balls, it's more democratic." Bruin pitchers **Amanda Freed** and **Keira Goerl** could be given that same piece of advice.

This year, strikeouts have been the popular path to outs for the Bruin pitching staff, as Goerl has 11 double-figure strikeout games with three 9-K performances, while Freed had a 12K day against Cal State Fullerton on Feb. 27, a 10K no-hitter against Virginia on March 9, an 11-K performance on April 21 to go along with three 9K performances.

Both have impressive strikeout-to-walk ratios in the circle, with Freed checking in at 3.4:1 (147K, 43BB) and Goerl at 4.6:1 (266K, 58BB). In 2001, each had one double-figure strikeout performance, with Goerl's coming in a 14-inning game. Freed had one game with nine K's, while Goerl had two. In relation to strikeouts per seven innings (how the NCAA tabulates leaders), Goerl is recording 9.03 K/7 IP, while Freed checks in at 6.9 K/7 IP.

SUA SLAMS HER WAY OUT OF MID-SEASON SLUMP

Sophomore designated player **Claire Sua** has wielded one of the most dangerous bats in the Pac-10 during the last few weeks. After struggling through the early part of the Pac-10 season, Sua returned to the basepaths in impressive fashion, hitting towering home runs in both games against Oregon at Easton Stadium (April 20-21). She followed with a game-winning grand slam home run on April 24 against Washington, taking the Bruins from a 3-1 deficit to a 5-3 lead with one swing of the bat in the sixth inning. She added a second slam on May 11 in game two vs. Arizona State.

Her offensive explosion did not stop when UCLA hit the road, as she homered in consecutive at-bats during UCLA's 13-2 victory over Stanford on the day Stacey Nuveman tied the NCAA's career home run record. Sua currently has 13 home runs this season with six coming in Pac-10 play.

MIMS POISED FOR POSTSEASON

UCLA's regular first baseman through the Pac-10 season, junior **Tairia Mims** continues to be a steady presence in the Bruin lineup. Mims, a two-time All-College World Series selection, is one of three Bruins to record three consecutive games with a home run. She started the streak on April 28 at Stanford, golfing a solo first-inning shot over the fence down the left field line in a game that UCLA won 2-0. She followed by recording the RBI on both Bruin runs at Oregon on May 3, an RBI double in the first inning and a solo home run in the third inning.

Mims completed the three home run cycle on May 4 at Oregon State, recording UCLA's first four RBIs on the day. Once again, Mims posted an RBI double in the first inning, followed by a three-run home run in the second inning. With a towering two-run homer in Saturday's first game, Mims now has 11 home runs on the season with six coming in Pac-10 play.

BRUINS DOMINATE PAC-10 STATISTICS

Two of the top three hitters in the country, based on batting average, wear a Bruin uniform.

UCLA leads the nation's premier softball conference in team batting average (.347) and team ERA (0.71), and has players leading the league in eight offensive and two pitching statistical categories. At the top of the batting average list are **Stacey Nuveman** (.549, 1st NCAA) and **Natasha Watley** (.500, 3rd NCAA), and both players lead additional offensive categories. Nuveman currently leads all three of the categories that define offensive production, adding the slugging percentage (1.063) and on-base percentage (.675) numbers to top the Pac-10.

Watley adds a list of leads to her second-place batting average ranking, leading the league in hits (101), triples (7), stolen bases (37) and steal attempts (44).

In the circle, **Keira Goerl** (0.54) leads the Pac-10 in ERA with **Amanda Freed** (0.89) standing in third place. Goerl also leads the Pac-10 in opposing batting average, holding opposing offenses to a .113 clip.

INJURY REPORT

Junior second baseman **Monique Mejia** missed seven games after suffering an open dislocation of the middle finger on her left (glove) hand. She had four stitches to close the wound. Mejia injured the hand while sliding head-first into the bag while stealing second base in the fifth inning of UCLA's April 19 game against Oregon State, returning to the lineup on May 4 against the Beavers in Corvallis. She has played right field rather than second base since her return.

NUVEMAN NOTES:

- History was made on May 4 at the OSU Softball Complex in Corvallis, OR, when Nuveinan blasted the 86th home run of her UCLA career, a lead-off first-pitch home run in the top of the seventh inning. She has since added two more home runs, a three-run shot against Oregon State on May 5, and a two-run homer against Arizona on May 10 at UCLA's Easton Stadium. She enters postseason play with 88 career home runs.
- 11 of Nuveinan's 18 home runs this season have been against teams ranked in the NFCA top-17 at game time, including 10 home runs in Pac-10 games.
- Nuveinan has homered in each of her last three official at-bats against Arizona All-American Jennie Finch.
- Her career slugging percentage, entering postseason play, is .947, which is 150 points better than the existing NCAA career slugging percentage record.
- Nuveinan started the season going 3-for-3 with two walks, and her season batting average has never dipped below .500 at any point during the 2002 season. The lowest point was .500 after an 0-for-3 day against then-No. 12 Nebraska on Feb. 9
- Nuveinan is a three-time Pac-10 Player of the Year (1999, 2001, 2002), three-time first-team All-American (1997, 1999, 2001), and a two-time NFCA/Diamond Sports Catcher of the Year (1999, 2001). She is also a two-time Honda Award finalist (1999, 2001).
- Nuveinan is the third Bruin to be named a three-time Pac-10 Player of the Year, joining UCLA greats Lisa Longaker (1987, 1988, 1990) and Lisa Fernandez (1991-93) as the only three-time Pac-10 Players of the Year in history.
