

2005 SEASON IN REVIEW

For the sixth time in seven years, the 2005 UCLA women's volleyball team advanced to NCAA Regional play, a solid finish to what was a roller coaster season.

The Bruins opened the season at the Sands Regency/SBC Tournament in Reno, Nev., where the Bruins posted wins over Eastern Kentucky, San Diego and Nevada. Juniors **Nana Meriwether** and **Colby Lyman** were named to the All-Tournament team with Lyman earning MVP honors.

Up next was the Waikiki Beach Marriott Classic in Honolulu, Hawaii, where the Bruins posted a sweep of Cal State Northridge, a five-game win over Cincinnati and a four-game loss to the host Rainbow Wahine. Meriwether and freshman **Kaitlin Sather** earned All-Tournament honors.

UCLA's final pre-season tournament was the InnTowner Invitational in Madison, Wis. The Bruins won matches against Valparaiso and Villanova, but with a steep price attached as Lyman and sophomore transfer **Meghan Schoen** were lost to injuries in consecutive matches. A torn ACL for Schoen closed the books on her first season as a Bruin after just eight matches. During warm-ups for the tournament finale against host Wisconsin, Sather suffered a dislocated kneecap and was lost for the match. Two Bruins were named to the InnTowner All-Tournament team: Meriwether and freshman setter **Nellie Spicer**.

Battling significant injuries as well as stiff competition, UCLA would lose four consecutive matches against ranked opponent before playing host to the Oregon schools on the third weekend of Pac-10 play. UCLA swept the Ducks and Beavers in Pauley Pavilion, then went on to split the series in the state of Washington and a home series against the Arizona schools. Following a hard-fought loss at USC, the Bruins ripped off six straight victories to improve to 17-8 overall and 9-6 in Pac-10 play.

That streak of wins opened with a pair of victories at Oregon and Oregon State, followed by a dramatic five-game win at Pepperdine with the fifth game of the match extended to 17-15 in UCLA's favor.

The Bruins then returned to Pauley Pavilion for a three-game win over Washington State, earning the 999th career victory for UCLA head coach **Andy Banachowski**. The following night, second-ranked, undefeated and eventual NCAA Champion Washington came to town, setting up an unforgettable dramatic match.

UCLA opened the match with a pair of stunning game wins, taking game one 34-32 and game two by a 30-27 margin. After the break, the Huskies rebounded with a come-from-behind 30-28 third game win before forcing game five with a 30-25 game four victory. Washington took an early fifth game lead but UCLA

stormed back, culminating the two-hour, 49-minute match with a 15-13 Bruins win, achieving the 1,000th career victory for Banachowski and earning the honor of putting the lone loss on Washington's 2005 record.

Banachowski became the first NCAA Division I women's coach to reach 1,000 career victories. The only other Division I coach of either gender to reach that milestone is UCLA men's coach Al Scates, who Banachowski played for during his UCLA career.

Following the week of wins over Pepperdine, Washington State and Washington, **Spicer** was named Pac-10 and Sports Imports AVCA National Player of the Week. Spicer became just the third Bruin in history to earn that honor, joining Annett Buckner (Oct. 17, 1994) and Kristee Porter (Oct. 19, 1998) on that elite list.

The Bruins completed their regular season schedule with a pair of home matches against the Bay Area schools, falling to then-No. 6 Stanford in four games before topping No. 12 California in four.

NCAA Selection Sunday saw the Bruins placed as the 16th national seed and UCLA's Pauley Pavilion selected as a host site for first and second round play. The Bruins opened with a four-game win over Kansas before a 95-minute three-game sweep of San Diego propelled UCLA to its sixth NCAA Regional appearance in a seven-year span.

The trip to Omaha, Neb., saw the Bruins play in front of a then-NCAA record crowd of 14,489 fans against local favorite Nebraska, the top national seed. UCLA played close with the Huskers through the opening game of the match but were unable to prevail, losing in three games.

Three Bruins, Meriwether, Spicer and **Nancy Barba**, the team's only senior, earned All-Pac-10 honors with Meriwether and Spicer earning first-team honors while Barba earned honorable mention notice. Spicer was also selected to the Pac-10 All-Freshman first team along with Sather, while libero **Jordan Smith** was among the honorable mention selections. Conference academic honors went to Lyman and Meriwether, who were honorable mention All-Academic.

Meriwether, the team's MVP, earned AVCA All-Region honors and was selected to the All-America third team.

THE PAC-10 CONFERENCE

Entering the 2006-07 season, the Pacific-10 Conference continues to uphold its tradition as the "Conference of Champions."® Pac-10 members have claimed an incredible 138 NCAA team titles over the past 16 seasons, for an average of more than eight championships per academic year.

Even more impressive is the breadth of the Pac-10's success, as those 138 team titles have come in 24 different men's and women's sports. The Pac-10 has led the nation in NCAA Championships 40 of the last 46 years and finished second five times.

Spanning nearly a century of outstanding athletics achievement, the Pac-10 has captured 351 NCAA titles (251 men's, 100 women's), far outdistancing the runner-up Big Ten Conference's 205 titles.

The Pac-10 captured nine NCAA titles in 2005-06 to lead the nation. It should be noted that the Pac-10 total does not include CALIFORNIA's national championship in rugby or men's crew, as they are not counted as NCAA titles. The Pac-10 led the nation with the most NCAA titles in women's sports with six.

NCAA team champions from the Pac-10 in 2005-06 came from UCLA (men's volleyball and women's water polo), STANFORD (women's cross country and women's tennis), ARIZONA (softball), CALIFORNIA (women's rowing), USC (men's water polo), WASHINGTON (women's volleyball) and OREGON STATE (baseball). The Pac-10 also had runners-up in six NCAA Championship events: men's basketball (UCLA), women's soccer (UCLA), women's golf (USC), women's outdoor track and field (USC), men's swimming and diving (ARIZONA) and women's indoor track and field (STANFORD). The Trojans also competed in the BCS National Championship Game, but football is not recognized as an NCAA title. Overall, the Conference had 15 teams finish in the top three at NCAA Championship events.

Since the NCAA began conducting women's championships 25 years ago, Pac-10 members have claimed at least four national titles in a single season on 17 occasions. Overall, the Pac-10 has captured 100 NCAA women's crowns, easily outdistancing the Southeastern Conference, which is second with 66. Pac-10 members have dominated a number of sports, winning 18 softball titles, 17 tennis crowns, 11 of the last 16 volleyball titles, 11 of the last 17 trophies in golf and eight in swimming and diving.

Currently, the Pac-10 sponsors 11 men's sports and 11 women's sports. Additionally, the Conference is a member of the Mountain Pacific Sports Federation (MPSF) in four other men's sports and two other women's sports.

The Pacific-10 Conference offices are located 25 miles east of San Francisco in Walnut Creek, Calif.

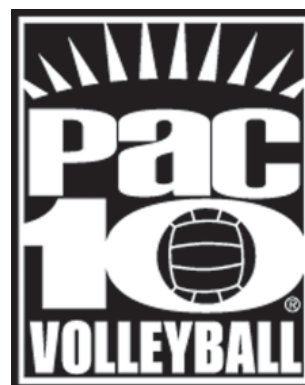
