Clements started the first nine matches of the season before suffering a torn right ACL against Cal State Northridge on Sept. 14 ... earned a medical redshirt and will be a redshirt sophomore in 2008 ... averaged 2.38 kills per game, playing in 24 games ... recorded 16 blocks (0.67 bpg) ... posted a career high with 13 kills and 15.5 points and tied a personal best with five blocks in a victory against Kansas State on Sept. 2 ... hit .571 against the Wildcats with just one error in 21 swings, leading the Bruins in kills and blocks in that match ... followed that with a 12-kill performance the next night in a win at Hawai'i, swinging at a .450 percentage (12-3-20) ... had at least five kills in seven of her eight completed matches ... posted seven digs in the season-opening win against Utah (Aug. 24) ... had a pair of blocks in five of her first six matches ... served a pair of aces in a win against Southern Mississippi (Sept. 8).

2006

Played in 16 games over 10 matches, starting once against Georgia on Sept. 9 ... fell just short of a double-

double against the Bulldogs, posting nine kills and nine digs, along with three block assists and 10.5 points ... had at least one kill in all 10 matches played, including a perfect 4-for-4 effort against Long Island on Sept. 16 ... registered four block assists against Colorado (Sept. 1) and Towson (Sept. 12).



Daley earned All-Pac-10 honorable mention accolades after placing second on the team with 3.69 kills per game and 3.66 digs per game and first with 4.48 points per game, 39 aces and 16 block solos ... recorded a team-high 23 double-doubles, including nine straight from Oct. 27 to Nov. 24 ... started all 32 matches she appeared in, playing in 118 games ... was third in total blocks (94), averaging 0.80 blocks per game ... was fifth in the Pac-10 in aces per game (0.33) and 10th in digs per game ... had a team-high 1,413 attempts, the third highest single-season total in UCLA history ... her 432 digs were the seventh-most in a single season and her 3.66 digs per game were the eighth-highest total for one year ... led the Bruins in kills during 16 matches, including a career-high 26 against Oregon State on Oct. 12 ... also had a career-best 25 digs against the Beavers, making her the first Bruin to post a 20-20 match since Nov. 2, 2001 (Ashley Bowles) ... posted 21 kills in a win at San Diego, one of 28 double-figure kills matches, which tied for the team lead ... surpassed the 1,000 career kill mark at Oregon State (Nov. 8) ... had 24 straight matches with at least 10 kills (Sept. 3-Nov. 24) ... swung a season-best .364 (15-3-33) in a victory against Arizona State on Sept. 21 ... recorded double figures in digs a team-best 25 times, posting at least 20 digs in matches against Oregon State (25) on Oct. 12, at California (21) on Sept. 27 and at Pepperdine (20) on Nov. 20 ... led the team in digs nine times ... had an ace in 25 of 32 matches, including three on four occasions ... registered at least five blocks in seven contests, tying a career high with seven blocks (two solos, five assists) in a win against Arizona (Sept. 20) ... set a career best with three solo roofs in a victory at Arizona State (Nov. 23) ... led the Bruins in points 14 times, posting a careerhigh 29.5 against Oregon State (Oct. 12).

2006

Started 26 of the 36 matches she appeared in, playing in 111 of a possible 128 games ... was fourth on the team with 2.92 kills per game, third with 23 aces and fifth with 2.29 digs per game ... posted six double-doubles, 15 double-figure kills matches and nine double-figure digs contests ... led the Bruins with 16 kills and a seasonhigh 15 digs in the National semifinal against Nebraska, hitting .366 for the match ... also had double-doubles against Florida on Sept. 2 (15 kills, 11 digs), Florida International on Sept. 15 (10, 10), Oregon on Sept. 21 (16, 13), Oregon State on Sept. 22 (11, 14) and Arizona on Oct. 6 (14, 10) ... posted season highs in kills (19) and points (20) against Maryland on Sept. 16, also hitting .531 ... made a season-high seven blocks and tied a yearbest with three aces in the Regional semifinal victory over Oklahoma on Dec. 8.

LONG BEACH STATE

Named Big West Conference Freshman of the Year and All-Big West first team during her 2005 campaign at Long Beach State ... was a two-time Big West Player of the Week (Sept. 26 and Nov. 7) ... ranked sixth in the conference in hitting percentage at .314 and ninth in kills per game at 3.47 ... also averaged 2.16 digs per game ... had a season-high 24 kills against Saint Mary's on Sept. 24 ... went three consecutive matches (Oct. 14-22) without an attack error, recording 30 kills on 55 attacks for a .545 hitting percentage during that stretch.

NEVADA UNION HIGH SCHOOL

Daley attended Nevada Union High School in Grass Valley, Calif. ... was the first freshman to make the varsity volleyball team, starting at outside hitter ... broke numerous scoring records in her junior season with 562 kills, helping the Miners to Metro, Sac Joaquin and Northern California Division I Championships ... Nevada Union placed second in the state championship, where Daley was named to the All-Tournament Team ... named to Prep Volleyball Top-15 list and also earned All-American honors ... compiled 814 kills, 439 digs, 164 blocks and 105 aces in her senior campaign, leading the state in each category, earning league, school and Sacramento Bee MVP honors and helping the Miners to another sweep of the Metro, Sac Joaquin and Northern California Championships ... was a member of the 2004 and 2005 A-2 Junior National Team.






