2004 Wrap-Up

The 2004 cross country season saw the Bruin women qualify for their fourth consecutive NCAA Championship team appearance and an All-American honor for Bruin senior Jon Rankin.

Women

The Bruins capped off their season in Terre Haute, IN, with a 27th-place team finish as sophomore Ashley Caldwell led the women with a 98th-place finish (21:55.0). At West Region, sophomore Alison Costello, the Bruins' No. 1 runner all season, highlighted a sixth-place finish for the women as she ran 21:21 to place 22nd overall, earning All-West Region honors. At Pac-10's, it was again Costello, leading the team to a fourth-place finish, running 21:30 and a 15th-place individual finish. The team was bolstered by freshmen Olga Aulet-Leon and Monika Rothenburger (the team's newcomers of the year), who added depth throughout the season. Coupled with senior Carmen Winant and juniors Allison Hall and Jenna Timinsky, the Bruins had a successful 2004 campaign.

Men

Senior Jon Rankin led the Bruin men in 2004 from start to finish, capped off by an All-American performance (first of his career) at the NCAA Cross Country Championships (39th, 31:49.8). Rankin also earned All-West Region and All-Pac-10 honors after finishing sixth at the West Region meet (30:30) and fifth at the Pac-10 Championships (24:31). Backed by a strong group of runners - seniors Erik Emilsson and Ben Aragon, along with juniors Martell Munguia and Nick DeFelice, sophomore Austin Ramos and freshmen Mike Haddan and Kyle Shackleton, the men recorded their highest finish at the West Region meet (4th) since 1996, as well as the Pac-10 meet (5th).

Former Oregon distance All-American Eric Peterson, entering his 13th year on the staff of the UCLA track and field program, has established himself as one of the top collegiate cross country and distance coaches in the nation.

A member of Jeanette Bolden's UCLA women's track & field staff, Peterson helped coach the Bruins to the 2004 NCAA Outdoor, second-consecutive West Region and eighth-consecutive Pac-10 championships.

He begins his sixth season as head coach for both the UCLA women and men's cross country teams and specialty coach for the Bruin women and men's track distance corps. For the past 11 years (1994-04), Peterson has been the UCLA women's cross country head coach. Prior to that, in 1993, he served as an assistant to then-Bruin cross country head coach Bob Larsen, the 2004 U. S. Olympic men's distance coach.

Peterson has enjoyed a successful 12 seasons with the UCLA women's cross country and distance teams. For six (2004-03-02-01-99-98) of the last seven cross country campaigns, including the last four seasons, he directed the Bruin women to a team berth at the NCAA Cross Country Championships, UCLA's first appearances since 1988.

2004-05 UCLA Women

In cross country, UCLA once again advanced as a team to the NCAA Championships, placing 27th. Sophomore Ashley Caldwell was UCLA's top runner at the nationals, placing 98th (21:55.0/6000m). Sophomore Alison Costello was UCLA's No. 1 runner most of the season – she was the Bruins' No. 2 performer at the NCAA and led UCLA at the West Region (22nd/21:21/ 6000m-earning All-Region honors) and Pac-10 (15th/21:20/6000m) meets. Costello is the 2004 U.S. Junior Cross Country champion. The Bruin women placed fourth at the Pac-10 and sixth at the West Region Championships.

At the Pac-10 Outdoor Track & Field Championships, the Bruins had two scorers in the 10,000m – senior Valerie Flores (4th/36:51.56) and junior Sarah West (7th/37:27.75). In the 3000m steeplechase, Costello finished fourth, with a school record time of 10:31.34. Flores, in 2003 cross country as a senior, led the Bruins to a seventh-place team finish (highest since 1985) at the NCAA Championships and earned All-American honors (20th/20.89). Her 35:08.05 in the 10,000m is No. 6 in UCLA history.

A stalwart for the UCLA women's distance corps has been senior Jenna Timinsky. She has been a major contributor helping the Bruin cross country squad to three consecutive NCAA Championship team appearances and her 2:06.26 800m is No. 9 in school history. As a redshirt freshman in 2003 outdoor track, she placed third in the 800m at the U. S. and fourth at the Pan Am Junior Championships.

Caldwell missed all of outdoor track with a stress fracture (left tibia). In 2003-04 as a sophomore, Caldwell earned three All-American honors - in cross country (36th/20:45.6), indoor track (distance medley relay, third leg/3rd/11:08.70) and outdoor track (800m/10thQ/2:06.51/top eight Americans) and won the Pac-10 800m (2:06.88/her personal-best 2:05.01 is No. 4 in UCLA history).

2004-05 UCLA Men

Senior Jon Rankin paced the Bruin men last season. In cross country, he was an All-American, the 16th Bruin in men's history to garner the honor (Rankin placed 39th/31:49.8/10,000m at the NCAA Championships). He also earned All-West Region (6th/30:30/10,000m) and first-team All-Pac-10 honors (5th/24:31/8000m). Seniors, Erik Emilsson and Ben Aragon, also earned All-West Region honors, placing 12th (30:43) and 20th (31:02). As a team in 2004, the Bruin men finished fourth at the West Region and fifth at the Pac-10.

As a junior at the 2003 NCAA Cross Country Championships, Emilsson was an individual qualifier for the Bruins (98th/30:52.7).

In outdoor track, Rankin won the 1500m at the West Region (3:44.07) and Pac-10 (3:44.61, the first Bruin in 40 years to win the conference title) Championships. The school record-holder in the 1500m (3:35.26) and No. 4 in UCLA history in the 800m (1:47.11), Rankin last spring became just the second Bruin in the last 25 years to run a sub-four minute mile (3:57.89, No. 3 in school history). In 2001 as a freshman, Rankin won the U. S. Junior 1500m title.

Also in outdoor track at the NCAA Championships – Emilsson, a junior in outdoor eligibility, earned All-American honors in the 3000m steeplechase (8th/personal-best 8:34.80, No. 3 in UCLA history) and junior Martell Munguia qualified in the 800m (his personal-best 1:48.14 is No. 10 in school history).

In indoor track, the Bruins' distance medley relay (DMR), placed second at the NCAA, earning All-American honors for seniors Aragon and Rankin and junior Munguia. As a junior at the 2004 Pac-10 Championships, Aragon won the 800m (1:48.51) and he's the indoor mile school record-holder (4:00.38).

A young distance standout is junior Austin Ramos. As a sophomore last season at the 2005 USA Cross Country Championships, Ramos placed 24th (out of 84 runners) in the Open Men's 12km competition, with a time of 39:13.8.

Peterson's UCLA Coaching Career

country, Hecox Candaele was a two-time Pac-10 Champion (1993-94), Region Champion (1993) and a two-time All-American (1994, 9th/1993, 10th). In outdoor track, she won the 1994 NCAA 3000m title. In 1998, Hecox Candaele was a member of the USA World Cross Country bronze medal team in Morocco at 4000m. In the summer of 2000, Peterson coached her to the 1500m final at the U. S. Olympic Trials, where Hecox Candaele placed eighth.

Katherina Kechris – in 1997 in outdoor track, she placed 12th at the NCAA in the 3000m and in 1998 cross country, Kechris was an All-Region VIII performer and earned Academic All-American honors.

Melissa McBain – as a senior in 2003-04, McBain earned three All-American honors in cross country (50th/20:53.6), indoor track (DMR, first leg/3rd/11:08.70) and outdoor track (1500m/10thQ/4:24.13/top eight Americans).

Lena Nilsson – one of the greatest distance runners in UCLA

women's history, during her Bruin career (2001-04) Nilsson won two individual NCAA titles (2003 NCAA Indoor 800m/2002 NCAA Outdoor 1500m Champion), was a two-time (2003-02) Pac-10 Track & Field Athlete of the Year (the first women's athlete in league history to repeat as the conference 800m/1500m champion) and she's the school record-holder in the 800m (2:02.26) and 1500m (4:07.69). She also earned All-American honors in cross country in 2002 (17th/20:10.0).

2002 NCAA Indoor Distance Medley Relay Champions — 10:58.19 (Tiffany Burgess, 1200m/Monique Henderson, 400m/ Jessica Marr, 800m/Lena Nilsson, 1600m). Burgess at one time held the school record in the 800m (2:03.73, 2002) and at the 2003 NCAA Indoor, she earned All-American status in the 800m.

Ysanne Williams – during her Bruin career, she was a six-time All-American (including 2001 NCAA Outdoor in the 800m) and in 1999, Williams was the Pan Am and U. S. Junior 800m champion.

Bruin Men Distance Standouts under Peterson

Along with Rankin, Aragon and Emilsson, another Bruin men's distance standout was Bryan Green. Green, one of the top men's UCLA distance runners during Peterson's early Bruin coaching career, twice qualified as an individual to the NCAA Cross Country Championships in 2000 and 2001. In outdoor track, his 10,000m time of 29:25.20 is No. 9 in UCLA history.

Peterson's Distance Running and Coaching Career

A former University of Oregon distance runner, Peterson was a member of the Ducks' 1989 Pac-10 Championship cross country team that placed second at the NCAA. In 1990 Peterson ran on Oregon's Pac-10 track & field championship team and placed second in the 1500m. He earned All-America honors in 1988 in the 1500m and was a two-time (1988, 1992) Olympic Trials qualifier. His personal best

times include a 1:49.78 (800m) and 3:41.03 (1500m).

As a prepster at North Eugene (OR) High School, Peterson was the 1985 Oregon State high school 800m champion and earned prep All-America honors in the 1500m and the mile.

Before coming to Westwood, Peterson served one season (1992-93) as Oregon's graduate assistant strength and conditioning coach and two years (1990-92) as assistant track and field and cross country coach at Rancho Bernardo High School in San Diego.

Peterson has trained and coached with some of the top distance coaches in the world, including Mike

Manley, a 1972 U.S. Olympian in the steeplechase; former Oregon head coach Bill Dellinger, a three-time Olympian in the 5000m; Luiz de' Olivera, who tutored Joaquim Cruz to the 1984 Olympic 800m title and Larsen (the 2004 U.S. Men's Olympic Distance Coach), who led the Bruin men's track & field team to two NCAA Outdoor titles (1988-87) and nine Pac-10 Championships in 15 years (1985-99).

SCOTT ABBOTT

Volunteer Assistant Coach:: UCLA '01



Abbott enters his first season as an assistant coach for the Bruins after coaching at Jesuit High School in Sacramento, CA. While at Jesuit, Abbott coached the team to the 2002 State Cross Country Championship. He also served as coach at Bend High School in Bend, OR where his team also won a state title in 2001. Abbott also served on the United State Olympic Committee Coaching Division in 1999.

While at UCLA, Abbott served as a team captain for the 1999 and 2000 seasons, and was a three-time Pac-10 All-Aca-

demic team member and two-time UCLA Track Student-Athlete of the Year. Abbott prepped at Jesuit HS where he led his team to three California State Team championships, and was named All-State and All-West in 1995.

Men's Preview, Roster & Biographies

A mix of experienced veterans, with a group of up and coming talented young runners, will lead UCLA this fall. The Bruins do lose their top three performers from last year's squad that had solid showings at both the West Region (fourth-place, ties best team finish since 1996) and Pac-10 (fifth-place, highest placement since 1997) Championships.

Veterans Returning

Returning for the Bruins in 2005 will be – seniors, Martell Munguia and Nick De Felice; juniors, Austin Ramos and Micky Cobrin; sophomores, Mike Haddan and Kyle Shackleton and redshirt freshmen, Drew Shackleton and Matt Stollenwerk.

Munguia in 2004-05 had a breakout season, especially in outdoor track. In cross country, he placed 63rd (26:36/8000m) at the Pac-10 Championships. In outdoor track, he qualified for the NCAA in the 800m (13th overall/1:49.45) and finished fourth at the West Region (1:48.91) and Pac-10 (1:48.63) Championships. His personal-best 1:48.14 is No. 10 in school history. In indoor track, Munguia earned All-American status on UCLA's distance medley relay, that placed second (9:33.60) at the NCAA Championships.

De Felice has been a cross country contributor since his true freshman season of 2002. As a junior in cross country last fall, he finished 62nd (26:36) at the Pac-10 and 70th (32:21/10,000m) at the West Region Championships. Last spring in outdoor track, De Felice had times of 15:16.87 in the 5000m and 31:15.73 in the 10.000m

Ramos had an impressive showing last February at the 2005 USA Cross Country Championships held at Vancouver, WA. Running in the Open Men's 12km, Ramos finished 24th (out of 84 runners) in a time of 39:13.8 (he was the youngest of the top 24 placements). In cross country last fall, Ramos was UCLA's No. 3 runner at the Pac-10 (21st/25:06) and No. 4 performer at the West Region (28th/31:30). As a redshirt freshman in outdoor track last spring, at the Pac-10 Championships, he placed eighth in the 10,000m (30:02.01) and ninth in the 5000m (14:15.61).

Cobrin, a two-year contributor to cross country, was UCLA's No. 5 runner at last fall's Pac-10 Championships, placing 48th (26:04). He redshirted the 2005 indoor and outdoor track seasons.

"Our team in 2005 showed tremendous improvement," said Peterson. "We proved that we have the capability to compete among the top teams in the West Region and perhaps the nation. Our goal is to build on last year's success, continue to be highly competitive in the conference and regional meets, and to qualify for nationals. Austin Ramos, one of the nation's up and coming stars, will lead our team. The other returning veterans are all capable of contributing to our team's success."

Underclassmen Returning

Haddan and the Shackleton twins lead the Bruins' pack of talented returning young runners. Haddan, named "Most Outstanding Freshman Distance Runner," last fall in cross country was UCLA's No. 5 finisher (55th/31:58) at the West Region and No. 7 runner (52nd/26:13) at the Pac-10. His outdoor track times last spring included a 1:51.61 (800m) and 3:51.38 (1500m).

The Shackleton twins ran well last February at the USA Cross Country Championships. Competing in the Junior Men's 8km, Drew placed 14th (26:18.5, out of 58 runners) and Kyle finished 21st (26:40.30). Drew also ran well at the NACAC Cross Country Championships (the U. S. vs. Jamaica and Puerto Rico) last March in Clermont, FL. Running on the gold medal winning USA team, he placed third (20:03) in the Junior 6k.

In cross country last fall, Kyle was UCLA's No. 6 runner at both the West Region (67th/32:16) and Pac-10 (51st/26:11) Championships. Drew redshirted in 2004 cross country.

"The Shackleton twins last year gained valuable experience at the national and international cross country levels, while Mike had a successful freshman season in cross country and track," said Peterson. "They all now have a year of experience at the collegiate level and I expect them to compete for scoring positions this fall."

Newcomers

A freshman who could make an impact this fall is Laef Barnes (Nine Mile Falls, WA/Mead HS). Barnes during his prep career was one of the nation's top distance runners. In 2004, he ranked No. 3 in the U.S. in cross country. A two-time (2004-05) indoor All-American, Barnes was the national indoor mile prep leader for the last two seasons (4:12.00 in 2005). His top marks included 4:07.07 (1600m), 8:59 (3200m) and 14:59 (5k).

Another freshman on the roster is Ryan Gordon (Pacific Palisades/Brentwood School), coached by former Bruin distance runner Devin Elizondo. In cross country, Gordon was a first-team All-CIF State member in 2003 and three-time (2004-02-01) second-team performer. In track last spring, he placed second at the CIF-SS finals in the 800m and won the Mt. SAC Invitational. His top high school times were 1:55.4 (800m), 4:25 (1600m) and 9:50 (3200m).

Losses

The Bruins lose last year's senior leaders and key contributors to the team – Jon Rankin, Erik Emilsson and Ben Aragon.

Rankin in 2004-05 had one of the finest year-long performances in Bruin men's distance history. In cross country, he earned All-Pac-10 and All-West Region honors and became only the 16th male runner in UCLA annals to earn All-American

honors, placing 39th (31:49.9/10,000m). At the NCAA Indoor Championships, Rankin ran on UCLA's second-place distance medley relay (9:33.60) and again earned All-American status. In outdoor track, he reached several milestones. In the mile, he became only the third Bruin in history (and the first since 1980) to run a sub-four minute mile (3:57.80). In the 1500m, he set the school record (3:40.39) and won the event at the West Region and Pac-10 Championships. At the 2005 USA Championships held in June at the Home Depot Center in Carson, Rankin placed sixth in the 1500m (3:43.41). In qualifying, he was third in his heat (3:39.71), setting a new personal-best and breaking his own school record of 3:40.39.

Emilsson in cross country last fall was UCLA's No. 2 runner at both the Pac-10 (20th/25:04) and West Region (12th/30:43-earning All-Region honors) and as a junior in 2003, he was an individual qualifier to the NCAA Championships. In track, Emilsson who will be a senior for the Bruins in spring 2006, at the 2005 NCAA Outdoor earned All-American honors in the 3000m steeplechase, placing eighth (personal-best 8:34.80, No. 3 in UCLA history).

Aragon in 2004 cross country was UCLA's No. 3 runner at the West Region (20th-31:02-earning All-Region honors) and No. 4 performer at the Pac-10 (28th-25:19). In 2005 indoor track, he earned All-American honors on the Bruins' distance medley relay. During his Bruin career, he set the indoor mile school record (4:00.38, 2003), won the Pac-10 800m title in 2004 (1:48.45) and in UCLA's dual meet victory over USC in 2003, Aragon won three distance events – 800m (1:50.35), 1500m (4:12.40) and 5000m (14:46.43).

From the 2004 squad that advanced to the NCAA Championships, placed sixth at the West Region and fourth at the Pac-10 Championships, UCLA returns six of its top seven runners for the 2005 campaign.

Experience and depth will be the keys to this season's Bruin women's cross country squad - led by seniors, Jenna Timinsky, Allison Hall and Sarah West; juniors, Alison Costello and Ashley Caldwell and sophomores, Olga Aulet-Leon, Monika Rothenburger and Claire Rethmeier.

Returners

Throughout most of last season's cross country campaign, Costello, the 2004 U. S. Junior Champion, was UCLA's No. 1 runner. Named the Bruins "Most Outstanding Cross Country Runner", Costello was UCLA's No. 2 performer at the NCAA Championships (148th/22:21.1/ 6000m) and leading runner at the West Region (22nd/21:21/6000mearning All-West Region honors) and Pac-10 (15th/21:30/6000m) Championships. In 2005 outdoor track, Costello set a new school record (10:31.34) in the 3000m steeplechase and placed fourth at the Pac-10.

Caldwell, who missed all of 2005 outdoor track with a stress fracture (left tibia), was the Bruins' top performer at last year's NCAA Championships, placing 98th (21:55.0). She was UCLA's No. 3 runner (30th/21:32) at the West Region and No. 5 runner at the Pac-10 (25th/21:54). Caldwell was UCLA's top finisher at the Pre-NCAA Meet (53rd/ 21:43.1/6000m). As a sophomore in 2003-04, she earned NCAA Championship All-American honors on three occasions cross country (36th/20:45.6), indoor track (DMR, third leg/ 3rd/11:08.70) and outdoor track (800m/10thQ/ 2:06.51/top eight Americans). Her 2:05.01 800m is No. 4 in school history.

Timinsky, a consistent cross country contributor for the last three seasons, in 2004 was UCLA's No. 2 runner (21st/21:44) at the Pac-10, No. 4 performer (36th/21:39) at the West Region and the Bruins' No. 5 runner at the NCAA (215th/23:06.4). As a junior in 2003 cross country, she earned All-West Region honors and in outdoor track, Timinsky was a Pac-10 800m scorer and her 2:06.26 is No. 9 in UCLA history. As a redshirt freshman in 2003 outdoor track, she placed third at the U.S. and fourth at the Pan Am Junior Championships in the 800m.

Hall, named "Most Improved Cross Country Runner" at the end of last season, has run on UCLA's last three NCAA qualifying squads. In 2004 as a junior, she was the Bruins' No. 3 runner at the NCAA (181st/22:41.2), finished 33rd (22:07) at the Pac-10 and 39th (21:42) at the West Region Championships. A redshirt last spring in outdoor track, Hall is a Pac-10 scorer in the 1500m.

West last season placed 39th (22:22) at the Pac-10 and 71st (22:20) at the West Region Championships. Last spring in outdoor track, she was a Pac-10 scorer in the 10,000m (7th/37:27.75).

"Our veterans have vast experience at the NCAA, West Region and Pac-10 levels," said Eric Peterson, entering his 12th year as UCLA's women's cross country head coach. "This team enters the season with as much experience as any I've ever coached here. I expect this group to report to camp in top shape and ready to go.

Their leadership and experience will be of tremendous value to our younger athletes."


Although just sophomores, Aulet-Leon, Rothenburger and Rethmeier picked up valuable experience in 2004-05 as true freshmen. At the 2005 USA Cross Country Championships, held Feb. 12-13 in Vancouver, WA, Rothenburger was UCLA's top finisher (15th, out of 52 runners, 23:13.3/6km), followed by Rethmeier (18th/23:29.4) and Aulet-Leon (22nd/23:57.4).

Last fall, Aulet-Leon was UCLA's No. 4 runner at the NCAA (189th/22:51.7), No. 2 performer at the West Region (28th/21:29) and No. 4 runner (21:50) at the Pac-10. Rothenburger was UCLA's No. 7 runner at the NCAA (228th/23:24.5) and No. 3 runner at the Pac-10 (22nd/21:49). Aulet-Leon and Rothenburger were "Co-Most Outstanding Freshman Cross Country Runners" following last fall's campaign. Rethmeier redshirted last fall.

"Olga, Monika and Claire as true freshmen gained significant knowledge and experience during their first season as college runners," said Peterson, who has guided the Bruin women's cross country squad to four consecutive NCAA Championship team appearances. "Last year's experiences and an additional year

Losses

Losses from last season include - Carmen Winant and Alejandra Barrientos. Winant, as a senior last fall in cross country, was UCLA's fifth finisher at the NCAA (193rd/22:54.6) and No. 9 runner at the Pac-10 Championships (55th/22:44). In outdoor track, her 35:15.04 10,000m is No. 8 in UCLA history. Barrientos concluded her Bruin career as a contributor to three (2004-02-01) UCLA cross country teams that qualified to the NCAA. In outdoor track, she was an NCAA 1500m qualifier (2004) and a two-time (2004-02) Pac-10 scorer in the 1500m. Her 4:17.60 1500m is No. 8 in school history.



In her UCLA career under Eric Peterson, Karen Hecox Candaele was the two-time (1994-93) Pac-10 Female Cross Country Athlete of the Year and won the 1994 NCAA Outdoor 3000m.



During his UCLA career (1994-98), Mebrahtom Keflezighi won four NCAA individual distance championships, including the 1997 NCAA Cross Country title. Most recently, he won the silver medal at the Athens Olympics in the marathon with a time of 2:11.29 and was the first American male to medal in the marathon since 1976. Keflezighi is the American Record Holder in the 10,000m (27:13.98, 2001), a three-time USATF National Champion in the 10,000m, and two-time World Championships competitor. He also competed in the Sydney Olympic Games in the 10,000m where he finished 12th overall.
