 Seven Home Games on the Schedule in 2012
 Next three contests in the Rose Bowl



ROSE BOWL: THE 31st YEAR

The 2012 season marks the 31st year that the Rose Bowl, currently undergoing a renovation, will serve as home of the Bruins.

The focus of the renovation project is to expedite tunnel ingress/egress, improve concourse circulation, increase the number of concession stands and restrooms, provide state-of-the-art premium seating products in a rebuilt press box and install a new scoreboard and video board.

UCLA moved to Pasadena from the L.A. Coliseum in the summer of 1982 and went 6-0-1 in that first year, capping the season with a victory over Michigan in the Rose Bowl game.

The 2006 season-opening win against Utah was UCLA's 100th at the Rose Bowl. The Bruins own a record of 124-56-2 since moving to Pasadena, including a 3-2 record in Rose Bowl games.

In July of 2007, the Rose Bowl was selected the No. 1 sports venue by SI.com/Slon-Campus.

HOME OPENER/ GAME 2 — The Bruins (1-0) will open their 31st season at home in the Rose Bowl with a non-conference game against Big Ten Conference opponent Nebraska (1-0, ranked 17th on the AP poll and 16th on the coaches poll) on Saturday, September 8. Kickoff is set for 4:50 p.m. PT and the game will be nationally televised by FOX with Gus Johnson and Charles Davis in the booth and Julie Alexandria on the sideline. UCLA began its 94th season of football, and first under the direction of head coach Jim Mora, with a 49-24 win at Rice on Thursday, August 30. AM 1150 (KTLK) and the Bruin IMG Radio Network (Chris Roberts, Matt Stevens and Wayne Cook) will radio broadcast the contest. The game will also be aired nationally on SIRIUS (Ch. 113), XM (Ch. 196).

VS. NEBRASKA — The Huskers and the Bruins have not met on the gridiron since the 1994 season. Nebraska, second-ranked at that time, won the contest, played in Lincoln, NE, 49-21, and leads the overall series, which dates back to a meeting in 1946, by a 6-4 count. The two teams last played in California in the 1993 season, a 14-13 Nebraska win in the Rose Bowl. Nebraska has been ranked either first or second in the nation in six of those previous meetings. The last Bruin win in the series came by a score of 41-28 in the 1988 season, in a game played in Pasadena, CA between then fifth-ranked UCLA and second-ranked Nebraska. One of UCLA's biggest wins ever came almost exactly 40 years ago over a number-one ranked Cornhusker team. The 1972 Bruin team, using a wishbone attack under the direction of first-year starter Mark Harmon, which had finished the previous season with two wins, snapped the 32-game unbeaten streak of the Huskers who had captured National Championships in 1970 and 1971. A field goal by Efen Herrera in the game's final seconds sent UCLA to a 20-17 win in the Los Angeles Coliseum.

- **LB Eric Kendricks has started the last four games and totaled 33 tackles in those contests ... he had a career-best 11 stops last week at Rice
- **UCLA has won 21 of its last 26 non-conference matchups in the Rose Bowl (dating back to 1998)
- **QB Brett Hundley became the third UCLA freshman quarterback to start a season-opener (Kevin Prince 2009, Bret Johnson 1989)
- **The 646 yards of total offense gained at Rice was the eighth highest in UCLA history
- **UCLA has won eight of its last 15 home games played against AP ranked opponents (dating back to 2005); last season, it lost to #24 Texas and defeated #20 Arizona State
- **UCLA played eight true freshmen in the opener at Rice - OL Simon Goines, WR Jordan Payton, F Kenneth Walker, CB Ishmael Adams, CB Fabian Moreau, DL Ellis McCarthy, PK Ka'imi Fairbairn, DB Randall Goforth
- **F receiver Steven Manfro, OT Simon Goines, OT Torian White, C Jake Brendel, DT Seali'i Epenesa, QB Brett Hundley each made their first career starts at Rice
- **UCLA had six 200-yard rushing games last season and opened the 2012 season with a 343-yard total at Rice ... The Bruins have won 22 straight games in which they have rushed for at least 250 yards (79-3-1 all-time)

FOR THE NEBRASKA GAME — Honorary Captain --- The Bruins welcome back James McAlister as this week's honorary captain. McAlister was a running back for the Bruins in the 1972 and 1973 seasons, earning first-team All-Pac-8 honors in 1972. He teamed with Kermit Johnson to form one of the most potent backfields in school history and helped to key one of the biggest wins in UCLA history, a 20-17 win over two-time defending National Champion Nebraska in 1972. He averaged 5.3 yards per carry for his career and totaled 1,492 yards. The team went 17-5 in his two seasons under head coach Pepper Rodgers. Also a standout on the track, McAlister's long jump of 27-0 1/2 has been a school mark since 1973. He was a sixth-round draft pick of the Oakland Raiders in 1974. After playing in the World Football League, McAlister went on to play in the NFL with the Philadelphia Eagles in 1975-1976 and the New England Patriots in 1978.
1972 UCLA FB Team --- Members of the team which defeated two-time defending national champion Nebraska in the season-opener of the 1972 season will be introduced during a quarter break at Saturday's game.
1961 UCLA FB Team --- Members of the 1961 team which captured UCLA's first outright AAWU (Athletic Assoc. of Western Universities) conference championship and went on to play in the 1962 Rose Bowl game will be introduced at halftime on Saturday.

THIS AND THAT ABOUT THE BRUINS — Linebacker **Eric Kendrick**(#6) is the son of former Bruin, Marv Kendrick, who led UCLA in rushing in 1970 and 1971; Eric's brother, Mychal, is a former linebacker at Cal who is now in the NFL ... Defensive back **Tevin McDonald**'s(#7) brother, Tim Jr., plays at USC and his dad, Tim, played in the NFL from 1987-99 with the Cardinals and 49ers ... Defensive back **Sheldon Price**'s(#22) dad, Dennis, played at UCLA from 1984-87 and then in the NFL with the Raiders ... Punter **Jeff Locke**(#18) has been named to the All-Conference academic team the past three seasons; he has finished 12th (2011), fourth (2010) and 16th (2009) in the nation in punting average ... OL **Xavier Su'a-Filo** (#56) spent the last two years on an LDS mission in Alabama and Florida during which time he learned the Spanish language ... LB **Anthony Barr**'s(#11) dad, Tony Brooks, was a fourth-round pick of the Eagles in the 1992 draft, after playing at Notre Dame ... Reserve fullback **Luke Gane**(#49) underwent chemotherapy and a bone marrow transplant in high school to help overcome a rare blood disorder (aplastic anemia) ... Offensive guard **Alexandru Ceachir** (#76) came to this country two years ago from Moldova (located between Romania and Ukraine) and can speak four languages - Russian, English, Romanian, Ukrainian ... Freshman linebacker **Aaron Porter**'s (#30) mom, Sandy, played in the Softball World Series for Long Beach State and is in the school's Hall of Fame ... Running back **Jordan James** (#6) has a black belt in Taekwondo ... Running back **Malcolm Jones**'(#28) brother, Marshall, played defensive back at USC ... Malcolm was selected to the first-team Pac-12 All-Academic team in 2011 ... Defensive back **Brandon Sermons**'(#2) brother, Rodney, also played for USC ... **Brett Hundley**'s(#17) dad, Brett, Sr., lettered at running back for the University of Arizona ... Most of the Bruin coaching staff has a tie to the NFL - head coach **Jim Mora** - 25 seasons with San Diego 1985-91, New Orleans 1992-96, San Francisco 1997-2003, Atlanta 2004-06, Seattle 2007-09; receivers coach **Eric Yarber** - 5 seasons with Tampa Bay 2010-11, San Francisco 2003-04, Seattle 1998; Defensive Coord. **Lou Spanos** - 17 seasons with Washington 2010-11 and Pittsburgh 1995-2009; Special teams Coord./ Linebackers coach **Jeff Ulbrich** - 2 seasons with Seattle 2010-11; Offensive Coordinator **Noel Mazzone** - 3 seasons with NY Jets 2006-08 ... Coaches who played in the NFL include Yarber, Ulbrich (who was on 49ers' defense coached by **Jim Mora**), Y receivers coach **Marques Tuiasosopo**, running backs coach **Steve Broussard**, offensive line coach **Adrian Klemm** ... Other players with NFL ties include freshmen **Ishmael Adams** (#24) (dad, Stefon, was selected in third rd. of 1985 draft); **Paul Perkins**' (#24) dad played football at Arizona State and with Tampa Bay and Indianapolis and his uncle, Don Perkins played with the Dallas Cowboys; redshirt freshman linebacker **Aaron Wallace**'s (#12) dad played at Texas A&M and for eight seasons with the Raiders; freshman quarterback **Jerry Neuheisel**'s (#11) dad played with Tampa Bay and San Diego and was the head coach at UCLA (2008-11) ... In addition, **Jerry Rice, Jr.**'s (#88) dad was a 13-time Pro Bowler with San Francisco and Oakland ... Y receiver **Joseph Fauria**'s (#8) uncle, Christian, played at Colorado and for 13 seasons in the NFL with Seattle, New England, Washington, Carolina ... P **Jeff Locke** was named UCLA's male Scholar Athlete of the Year for 2011-12.

COACH MORA'S TEAM — First-year head coach Jim Mora, a former NFC Coach of the Year while with the Atlanta Falcons, has 44 letterwinners returning for action. The Bruins welcome back six players who started the bulk of the games at their defensive positions in 2011 and seven more on the offensive side of the ball who were on the field for the first snap in the majority of games. Returning players with 20 or more starts under their belts include -- Offensive lineman **Jeff Baca** (34), running back **Johnathan Franklin** (33), defensive cornerback **Sheldon Price** (33), defensive end **Datone Jones** (30), quarterback **Kevin Prince** (26), defensive cornerback **Aaron Hester** (25), linebacker **Damien Holmes** (20). Also back is Y receiver **Joseph Fauria** who led the team with six touchdown grabs last season. Linebackers **Eric Kendrick** and **Jordan Zumwalt**, who ranked second and third, respectively, on the team in tackles last season return. Interception leaders **Andrew Abbott** (4) and **Tevin McDonald** (3) move back into the secondary. Punter **Jeff Locke**, one of the nation's best, is primed for a standout season.

WORKING OVERTIME — UCLA has a 7-1 record in overtime games, the last coming in the 2008 season-opener against Tennessee, a 27-24 win.

BRUINS VS. BIG TEN TEAMS — UCLA has a 45-40-3 record in all-time games played vs. the current members of the Big Ten. The Bruins last hosted a member of the conference in the Rose Bowl (Illinois) in the 2003 season.

A LOOK AT THE SCHEDULE — The combined record of UCLA's 2012 opponents was 82-70 (.539) in 2011. Houston (13-1 record last season) finished first in the nation in pass offense (450.07), total offense (599.07) and scoring (49.29) in 2011 and fourth in the country in turnover margin (1.14). Nebraska (9-4) ranked 15th in the nation in rushing offense (217.23) last season and returns running back Rex Burkhead who ranked 19th in rushing (104.38). NU kick returner Ameer Abdullah rated ninth in the nation in kickoff returns with a 29.35 average. Rice (4-8, win over Purdue) ranked 20th in the nation in turnover margin (0.67) and defensive back Bryce Callahan was tied for seventh in the nation in interceptions (0.50/g).

FRESHMEN OVER THE YEARS — Eight true freshmen -- CB Ishmael Adams, WR Jordan Payton, F Kenneth Walker, OT Simon Goines, CB Fabian Moreau, DB Randall Goforth, PK Ka'imi Fairbairn, DL Ellis McCarthy -- saw action in the opener at Rice.

A school-record 17 true freshmen played for the Bruins in 1977. Thirteen played in 1975, 12 in 1978, 1980 and 2004 and 10 played in 1979. In recent years, nine played in 2005, eight in 2006, two in 2007 and 11 in 2008. UCLA played 10 freshmen in 2009. The Bruins played 10 freshmen in 2010. Tight end Raymond Nelson (no longer on the roster) was the lone first-year player to see action in 2011.

AT THE STARTING LINE — The returning player with the longest starting streak is running back **Johnathan Franklin**, with 25. On defense, lineman Datone Jones has 15.

THE OFFENSE

QUARTERBACK — Redshirt freshman **BRETT HUNDLEY (#17)** scored a touchdown after taking his first snap as a college player at Rice. He raced 72-yards to paydirt on UCLA's initial offensive play from scrimmage. Hundley completed 21 of 28 passing attempts during the game for 202 yards and two touchdowns. He ran seven times for 68 yards.

Hundley graduated early from Chandler HS in Chandler, AZ and joined the Bruins in Winter Quarter 2011 (January). He took part in spring practice at UCLA, but was limited in the 2011 fall camp due to a summer knee injury. Hundley did not see action in the 2011 season. He participated in a second spring practice in 2012 and won the starting job in pre-season camp.

He threw for 2,348 yards as a senior in high school with 20 scoring passes, two interceptions. He also led his team in rushing with 856 yards and nine touchdowns. Following his senior prep season, he won the passing competition at the Under Armour All-America Game Skills Challenge. As a junior, he threw for 1,517 yards and 16 touchdowns with two interceptions. Hundley rushed for 1,208 yards and 12 touchdowns. He was named Arizona's Gatorade Player of the Year in 2009.

Redshirt senior **KEVIN PRINCE (#4)** started the last eight games (10 starts overall) of the 2011 season. He completed his junior season ranked among UCLA's all-time best in total offense (8th), pass completions (8th) and passing yards (9th). Prince finished up with 424 yards rushing for the 2011 season (most by Bruin qb since Jeff Dankworth racked up 815 in the 1976 season). His 163 yards rushing v. Cal marked the first time a Bruin quarterback had rushed for at least 100 yards in a game since Jeff Dankworth in 1976. It was the most rushing yardage by a quarterback since John Sciarra totaled 178 versus Tennessee in 1974.

In 2010, Prince appeared in five games, all starts. He was sidelined for the balance of that season after undergoing arthroscopic knee surgery on Oct. 23. True senior **RICHARD BREHAUT (#12)** came on in the fourth quarter of the Rice game and threw for 101 yards.

He appeared in seven games, with four starts, in 2011. He came on in relief of Kevin Prince in the opener at Houston and went on to start game two against San Jose State. He came off the bench against Texas and then started games at Oregon and at Stanford. He suffered a broken leg after starting game six against Washington State and was sidelined until late in the season. He came back for a brief appearance in the Pac-12 Championship Game and threw his first interception in 141 passing attempts.

In 2010, Brehaut appeared in nine games, with seven starts. He started the final six games of the season. Hall of Fame broadcaster Chris Roberts, a four-time Golden Mike Award winner, completed his 20th season as the voice of the Bruins. Former Bruin quarterback Matt Stevens was in his 15th year on the broadcast team and his 11th as the analyst in the booth. Former Bruin quarterback Wayne Cook finished up his 10th season as sideline reporter.

AM 570 KLAC also provides ancillary programming, including head coach and player interviews during game weeks.

UCLA IMG Sports Network games are also available nationally through an agreement with Sirius XM Satellite Radio, the Official Satellite Radio Partner of UCLA Athletics.

UCLA ON TELEVISION

Entering the Nebraska game, 96 of UCLA's last 97 games have been televised live, including 34 in a row.

All 14 of UCLA's games in the 2011 season were on live TV. In 2010, each of the 12 contests were broadcast live. The Oregon State game in 2009 is the last game not to be aired live (it was delayed).

OFFENSIVE LINE — The Bruins started three freshmen on the offensive line in a season-opening game for the first time in history. Redshirt freshmen Torian White joined true freshman Simon Goines at the tackle positions, Jake Brendel handled the center spot.

Redshirt senior **JEFF BACA (#60)**, the team leader with 34 career starts, started at guard. He started at tackle for 11 contests last season before sliding to guard against Illinois in the bowl game. In 2009, he started all 13 games at left guard. In 2008, he appeared in nine games with eight starts at left tackle.

True sophomore **XAVIER SU'A-FILO (#56)** returns to UCLA after serving a two-year Mormon mission. Su'a Filo started the Rice game at guard. He re-enrolled in school for the 2012 Winter Quarter and was back on the field in the spring. In 2009, he started all 13 games at left tackle which was the most starts by a Bruin true freshman at any non-kicking position. Su'a-Filo became the first Bruin true freshman to start a season-opener on the offensive side of the ball and earned Honorable Mention All-Pac-10 honors.

Redshirt freshman **JAKE BRENDEL (#54)** made his first start in the 2012 opener at Rice. He was named Coach Ed Kezirian "Coach K" Award winner for Academic and Athletic Balance. Brendel recorded 71 knockdown blocks, 31 finishes and allowed no sacks as a prep senior. Redshirt freshman **TORIAN WHITE (#77)** enjoyed a solid spring and started his first game at Rice. True freshman **SIMON GOINES (#70)** started the Rice game at tackle. Redshirt junior **GREG CAPELLA (#64)** lined up at guard for 13 games and moved in at center for the San Jose State game in 2011. Redshirt senior **BRETT DOWNEY (#78)** was a member of the Bruin special teams unit for placekicks in 2011 and appeared in two games at tackle. He made his first career start (OT) in the bowl game against Illinois.

RUNNING BACKS — Redshirt senior tailback **JOHNATHAN FRANKLIN (#23)** has started 33 career games. He began the 2012 season with a 214-yard effort at Rice, which included two 70-plus yard runs for touchdowns. He raced 74 yards midway through the first quarter for a touchdown and then traveled 78 yards for a score late in the second quarter. He became the first Bruin to have two runs of over 72 yards in a game. Franklin was named the Pac-12 Player of the Week for his efforts against the Owls.

The big start to the new season moved Franklin into eighth place on the all-time school rushing list with 2,883 yards. It was Franklin's 11th career 100-yard rushing day which ties him with Theotis Brown for seventh on the all-time school list. Franklin ran for a career-best 216 (30 carries) in a 2010 contest against Washington State (most since Maurice Jones-Drew ran for 322 at Washington in 2004).

In 2010, Franklin appeared in all 12 games and made 10 starts. He led the Bruins in rushing with 1,127 yards (5.3 ave), the 10th-best season mark in school history. He became UCLA's first 1,000-yard rusher since Chris Markey in 2006 (1,107), and totaled the highest yardage by a Bruin since Skip Hicks (1,282-1997). He ran for 118 yards against USC to become the first Bruin back to hit the century mark versus the Trojans since DeShaun Foster in 1998. Franklin saw action in all 13 games in 2009, making eight starts. He led the team with 566 rushing yards, 12th in the Pac-10 and No. 6 on UCLA's freshman rushing list.

HEAD COACH JIM MORA

On December 10, 2011, former NFC Coach of the Year Jim Mora was named UCLA's 17th head coach in school history. Mora comes to UCLA after spending part of 2010 and most of 2011 as a television analyst and contributor for the NFL Network and the NFL on Fox. He brings 25 years of NFL coaching acumen with him to UCLA, including four years of NFL head coaching experience while at the helm of the Atlanta Falcons (2004-06) and the Seattle Seahawks (2009).

Mora took over for Mike Holmgren as head coach of the Seattle Seahawks in 2009. He had served as assistant head coach and defensive backs coach for Seattle in the 2007 and 2008 campaigns. The Seahawks went 10-6 and finished first in the NFC West in the 2007 season and won the Wild Card game in the playoffs. In his initial season as the head coach of the Falcons in 2004, Mora guided the team to an 11-5 record, becoming just the eighth rookie head coach in NFL history to win 11 games and the 11th to bring home a Division title. Atlanta captured the NFC South title and earned an appearance in the NFC Championship game for only the second time in franchise history. Mora was selected as the NFC Coach of the Year. The Falcon's defense improved from a league ranking of 32nd in 2003 to No. 14 overall the next season, fueled by a league-leading and franchise record 48 quarterback sacks. Atlanta topped the NFL in rushing in all three of coach Mora's seasons as head coach. In 2006, Michael Vick became the first quarterback in NFL history to rush for at least 1,000 yards in a season.

Mora had joined the Falcons from the San Francisco 49ers where he spent seven seasons, from 1997-2003, including the last five as the defensive coordinator. In his first year, the 49ers finished No. 1 in the NFL in total defense, No. 2 in pass defense (with 25 interceptions), takeaways (41) and run defense, as well as No. 3 in the League in sacks (with 54). The 1998 squad tied for No. 1 in the NFC, and No. 4 in the NFL, with 21 interceptions. In the 2002 and 2003 seasons with San Francisco, the defense finished no worse than fourth in the NFL versus the run and in 2003, produced 42 sacks to tie for second in the conference. The 1997 team advanced to the NFC Championship Game and had three defensive players voted to the Pro Bowl, while the 1998 and 2002 squads captured Wild Card Game wins.

Mora worked the previous five seasons (1992-1996) on the staff of his dad, Jim E. Mora, as the secondary coach with the New Orleans Saints. His defensive expertise began to take shape and the Saints boasted the No. 1 pass defense in the NFL during his first two years. In 1985, Mora broke into the NFL coaching ranks with the San Diego Chargers under head coach Don Coryell. He spent seven seasons with the Chargers, advancing from the league's first quality control coach position to defensive backs coach, while working for head coaches Coryell, Al Saunders and Dan Henning.

Mora began his coaching career in 1984 at the University of Washington. He joined the staff of head coach Don James in the role of defensive assistant following a four-year playing career as a defensive back for the Huskies. While at UW, Mora had the opportunity to be a part of two Rose Bowl teams (1981-loss to Michigan and 1982-win over Iowa) as a player, in addition to helping the Huskies land a berth in the 1985 Orange Bowl (win over Oklahoma) as a graduate assistant. During his five seasons in the Husky program, Washington compiled a 48-12 record, ranked among the nation's top 10 teams on three occasions, and did not finish lower than second in the Pac-10 standings.

Three Bruin coaches and 11 players, including 2012 inductee Jonathan Ogden, 2010 inductee Randy Cross and 2008 inductee Troy Aikman, are enshrined in the National Football Foundation Hall of Fame.

UCLA has 13 former players currently working in the broadcast media - Troy Aikman, Charles Arbuckle, Wayne Cook, Randy Cross, Terry Donahue, Danny Farmer, David Norrie, Ron Pitts, Tom Ramsey, Matt Stevens, J.J. Stokes, Rick Walker, James Washington.

Twenty-two UCLA players have been selected to CoSIDA Academic All-America teams a total of 27 times. Offensive lineman Chris Joseph (2006, 2007) and wide receiver Cormac Carney (1981, 1982) were two-time first-team selections.

UCLA is the only school to produce six quarterbacks — Troy Aikman, Steve Bono, Billy Kilmer, Tommy Maddox, Tom Ramsey, Jay Schroeder — to have played that position on a Super Bowl team.

During the last 30 years (including 2011), UCLA has been ranked in the final Associated Press Top 25 on 12 occasions, second only to USC (17) among Pac-10 schools. Washington is next with 10 rankings.

The selection of tight end Mercedes Lewis by the Jacksonville Jaguars in the first round of the 2006 NFL draft marked the 29th time a UCLA player has been taken in round one.

Quarterback Drew Olson finished eighth in the 2005 Heisman Trophy balloting. It marked the 21st time that a Bruin has finished in the top 10 of the Heisman Trophy voting.

UCLA has had at least one former player participate in 28 of the last 31 Super Bowl games.

The only three-time consensus All-Americans in Pac-10 history are Bruins (LB Jerry Robinson and S Kenny Easley).

In the initial decade of the 2000's, UCLA had 12 finalists / winners of the National player awards --- 2009 Kai Forbath - Groza Award winner; 2005 Mercedes Lewis-Mackey Award winner; 2004 M. Lewis, Mackey finalist; 2002 Mike Seidman-Mackey finalist; 2004 Chris Kluwe-Ray Guy Award finalist; 2003 Dave Ball-Bronco Nagurski Award finalist; 2001 Robert Thomas-Dick Butkus Award finalist; 2000 Freddie Mitchell-Fred Biletnikoff Award finalist; 2003 D. Ball-Vince Lombardi Award finalist; 2006 Justin Hickman-Ted Hendricks Award finalist; 2003 D. Ball-Ted Hendricks Award finalist; 2003 D. Ball-Chevrolet National Defensive Player of the Year Award.

On May 13, 2007 UCLA became the first school in history to win 100 NCAA team championships. The Bruins currently have 108 NCAA titles to their credit (winning women's volleyball in 2011-12).

Redshirt senior punter **JEFF LOCKE (#18)** had six punts, three inside the 20, for a 43.7-yard average. He boomed all nine kickoffs for touchbacks. Locke ranked fifth in the Pac-12 and 12th in the nation with a 44.34 average in 2011. He also kicked his first field goals, making two against Texas. Locke's career punting average of 44.58 ranks first all-time at UCLA.
