UCLA BASKETBALL - 2016-17 PRESEASON NOTES

AT A GLANCE

• UCLA returns 10 players who competed during the 2015-16 regular season, including four of the team's five starters (Isaac Hamilton, Bryce Alford, Aaron Holiday and Thomas Welsh) ... the Bruins posted a 15-17 overall record and 6-12 mark in Pac-12 play last season.

• The Bruins welcome three freshmen to their 2016-17 roster – Ike Anigbogu, Lonzo Ball and T.J. Leaf ... all three incoming freshmen were nationally ranked among the top 25 incoming players in their high school class by Scout.com and Rivals.com ... all three players attended high school in southern California.

• Steve Alford enters his fourth season at the helm of UCLA's program in 2016-17 ... he has compiled a 65-40 record in three seasons in Westwood, having guided the Bruins to consecutive NCAA Tournament Sweet 16 appearances in 2014 and 2015 and the Pac-12 Tournament title in 2014.

• Three contributors, including one starter, from last season's team will not return in 2016-17 – Tony Parker (senior in 2015-16, eligibility expired), Jonah Bolden (chose to turn pro), Noah Allen (graduated from UCLA one year early and enrolled in graduate school at the University of Hawai'i).

• UCLA will return 77.0 percent of its total scoring and 58.3 percent of its total rebounding production from last season ... in addition, the Bruins bring back 87.3 percent of its total assist production from last year ... UCLA's returning players accounted for 74.9 percent of the team's minutes in 2015-16.

• As a group, UCLA's returning players shot 37.1 percent from the 3-point arc last season and took 92.6 percent of the team's total 3-point attempts ... likewise, the Bruins' returners shot 75.1 percent from the free throw line in 2015-16, accounting for 73.8 percent of the team's total made free throws.

LOOKING BACK

• Isaac Hamilton (16.8 ppg, 4.2 rpg, 3.3 apg) captured second-team All-Pac-12 honors as a junior ... Bryce Alford (16.1 ppg, 3.8 rpg, 5.2 apg) earned honorable mention All-Pac-12 accolades for the second straight year.

• Five players on UCLA's roster, including Hamilton and Alford, concluded the 2015-16 season having averaged at least 10.0 points per game ... also in that group were Tony Parker (12.6), Thomas Welsh (11.2) and Aaron Holiday (10.3).

• Sophomore center Thomas Welsh secured second-team Pac-12 All-Academic honors ... majoring in economics, Welsh became UCLA's first such academic selection since 2009-10.

• UCLA's victory over Kentucky in Pauley Pavilion on Dec. 3, 2015, marked the Bruins' first win over the nation's No. 1-ranked team since March 13, 2003, when the Bruins downed Arizona in the Pac-10 Tournament at Staples Center.

• Three Bruins finished the 2015-16 season ranked among the top 15 leaders in the Pac-12 in assists per game – Bryce Alford was second (5.2), Aaron Holiday finished eighth (4.0) and Isaac Hamilton was 14th (3.3).

• Bryce Alford was the league's second-leading shooter at the free throw stripe (83.1 pct), while Isaac Hamilton finished fourth in that category (80.5 pct) ... that duo accounted for 43.1 percent of UCLA's made free throws.

RETURNING PLAYERS FROM LAST SEASON'S STARTING LINEUP

Isaac Hamilton – 6-5, 195 – senior, guard – Los Angeles, Calif. (St. John Bosco HS)

- Finished last season as the team's leading scorer (16.8 ppg), ranking third in that category in the Pac-12
- Enters 2016-17 ranking third among all Pac-12 returners in career points per game (13.5)
- Has scored 919 career points, 81 shy of becoming the 54th player at UCLA to score 1,000 points
- Ranked fourth in the Pac-12 in free throw percentage last season (80.5 pct, 66-for-82)

Bryce Alford – 6-3, 185 – senior, guard – Albuquerque, N.M. (La Cueva HS)

- Has finished each of the last two seasons as UCLA's second-leading scorer (16.1 ppg in 2015-16)
- Enters 2016-17 ranking first among all Pac-12 returners in career field goals (411) and 3-pointers (213)
- As a junior (2015-16), was second in the Pac-12 in assists per game (5.2) and assist-turnover ratio (2.7)
- Has recorded at least 100 assists and a near 2-to-1 assist-turnover ratio in each of his three collegiate seasons

Thomas Welsh – 7-0, 245 – junior, center – Redondo Beach, Calif. (Loyola HS)

- Averaged 11.2 points and a team-leading 8.5 rebounds per game as a sophomore in 2015-16
- Has shot 55.0 percent from the field in his first two seasons at UCLA (219-for-398)
- Has totaled 71 blocks in 67 games (1.06 bpg), currently the sixth-highest career BPG average in school history
- Registered a team-high 10 double-doubles last season, scoring in double figures in 20 games

Aaron Holiday – 6-1, 185 – sophomore, guard – Chatsworth, Calif. (Campbell Hall HS)

- Recorded 10.3 points and 4.0 assists per game as a freshman in 2015-16
- Led the Bruins last season in three-point field goal percentage (41.9), making 39 of 93 attempts
- Scored in double figures in 20 of the Bruins' 32 games, including a season-high 19 points at Oregon (Jan. 23)
- Dished more assists (127) than any freshman at UCLA since his older brother, Jrue Holiday, had 129 in 2008-09

KEY CONTRIBUTORS

György "G.G." Goloman – 6-11, 215 – junior, forward – Körmend, Hungary (The Sagemont School [FL])

- Played in UCLA's final 15 games last season after missing the first 17 with a stress fracture (right leg)
- Has averaged 1.5 points and 1.9 rebounds in two seasons at UCLA (50 games, 11.2 minutes per game)

Prince Ali – 6-3, 190 – sophomore, guard – The Bronx, N.Y. (The Sagemont School [FL])

- Registered 3.9 points and 1.1 rebounds per game as a freshman in 2015-16
- Scored in double figures in three games, totaling a season-high 12 points in two contests

Alex Olesinski – 6-10, 200 – sophomore, forward – Roswell, N.M. (La Lumiere School [IN])

- Logged 1.2 points and 2.0 rebounds per game as a freshman in 2015-16
- Averaged 7.0 minutes per game, including an average of 10.2 minutes per game in 13 non-conference contests

100 PLUS

UCLA concluded the season as the only Pac-12 program to have at least three players with 100 or more assists. Bryce Alford finished with a team-high 167 assists, the second-highest total of any Pac-12 player, while Aaron Holiday had 127 and Isaac Hamilton totaled 106. This marked the first season since 2009-10 in which at least three Bruins had 100 or more assists (prior to 2009-10, that feat had not been accomplished at UCLA since 1997-98).

THREE-POINT THREAT

Bryce Alford became UCLA's first player since Arron Afflalo (in 2005-06, 2006-07) to have made at least 70 three-pointers in consecutive seasons. Alford, who made 73 attempts last year, concluded his sophomore season (2014-15) with a school-record 93 3-pointers. Alford heads into his senior season having made at least one 3-pointer in each of UCLA's previous 26 games. As a team, UCLA has made at least one 3-pointer in its previous 553 games (last time without a 3-pointer was on Feb. 3, 2000, at home against Stanford).

POINTS AND ASSISTS

Bryce Alford has become the sixth player in school history, on record, to have scored at least 1,300 career points and registered 400 or more assists. Alford has become the first UCLA player to equal or eclipse those two career totals since Darren Collison, who amassed 1,634 points and 577 assists over four seasons (2006-09).

CHALLENGING SLATE

Among Pac-12 teams, UCLA's non-conference schedule last year was rated the most challenging by KenPom.com. Overall, the Bruins played seven games against teams ranked in the top 20 of the AP poll – No. 1 Kentucky (W, 87-77, Dec. 3), No. 5 Kansas (L, 92-73, Nov. 24), No. 20 Gonzaga (W, 71-66, Dec. 12), No. 11 North Carolina (L, 89-76, Dec. 19), No. 7 Arizona (W, 87-84, Jan. 7), No. 17 Arizona (L, 81-75, Feb. 12) and No. 9 Oregon (L, 76-68, March 2).

UCLA has faced the nation's No. 1-ranked team four times in the last three seasons. Most recently, the Bruins defeated No. 1 Kentucky (87-77) in Pauley Pavilion on Dec. 3, 2015. In 2014-15, UCLA faced No. 1 Kentucky in Chicago on Dec. 20, 2014. In 2013-14, UCLA lost to No. 1 Arizona in Pauley Pavilion (Jan. 9, 2014) before losing to No. 1 Florida in the NCAA Tournament's Sweet 16. UCLA has gone 11-22 all-time against the Associated Press' No. 1-ranked team.

• Prior to UCLA's win over No. 1 Kentucky last season, UCLA had not defeated the nation's No. 1-ranked team in five previous tries. The Bruins last knocked off the No. 1 team on March 13, 2003, taking down No. 1 Arizona, 96-89, in overtime in a first-round Pac-10 Tournament game. The Bruins were unable to get the win in meetings against top-ranked Stanford (Feb. 2004), Kansas (Dec. 2009), Arizona (Jan. 2014), Florida (March 2014) and Kentucky (Dec. 2014).

• In 2013-14, UCLA had two games against No. 1-ranked teams. The Bruins lost to Arizona, 79-75, in Pauley Pavilion on Jan. 9, 2014, when the Wildcats entered with a 15-0 record and No. 1 ranking. UCLA had its season end against No. 1 Florida in the NCAA Tournament's Sweet 16 (game played on March 27, 2014 in Memphis).

• UCLA's win over Kentucky on Dec. 3, 2015, marked the program's first victory over a top-10 team (AP poll) since March 15, 2014, when the Bruins downed No. 4 Arizona, 75-71, in the 2014 Pac-12 Tournament championship game. UCLA landed its first home win over the nation's No. 1 team since Jan. 12, 2002 (vs. No. 1 Kansas, 87-77).

• Since the start of the 1999-2000 season, the Bruins have gone 5-8 against the nation's No. 1-ranked team. Eight of those 13 contests took place prior to 2004-05. Prior to two meetings in 2013-14 against Arizona and Florida, the Bruins had not faced the nation's No. 1-ranked team (AP poll) since Dec. 6, 2009 (Kansas).

- Leads all coaches, age 51 and under, in career NCAA victories with 528 (Steve Alford turned 51 on Nov. 23, 2015) ... will enter the 2016-17 season with a 528-275 record in 25 years and a 450-246 record at the NCAA Division I level the past 21 seasons ... has averaged 24.4 wins per season the past nine years (2007-08 through 2015-16).
- In his first season as UCLA's head coach (2013-14), he steered the Bruins to a 28-9 overall record, a trip to the NCAA Tournament's Sweet 16 and the Pac-12 Tournament title ... in 2014-15, he guided UCLA back to the NCAA Tournament's Sweet 16 after having advanced to the Pac-12 Tournament semifinals.
- While in Albuquerque, helped New Mexico secure four MWC regular-season championships and two tournament titles ... coached the Lobos to its two highest single-season victory totals (30 wins in 2009-10, 29 wins in 2012-13).
- Only head coach in school history at Iowa to have led the Hawkeyes to the Big Ten Tournament's title game (accomplishing that feat in 2001, 2002 and 2006) ... led Iowa to the Big Ten Tournament Championship in 2001 and 2006 ... established a school-record seven consecutive winning seasons at Iowa (2001-2007).
- Guided Missouri State (then named Southwest Missouri State) to its only appearance in the NCAA Tournament's "Sweet 16" in 1999 ... took over as head coach at Missouri State in the summer of 1995 at age 31 after having led Manchester College to the NCAA Division III championship game in March 1995.

Steve Alford concluded his 25th season as a collegiate head coach in 2015-16. In his first two seasons as UCLA's head coach, he led the Bruins to two Sweet 16 appearances and one Pac-12 Tournament crown (2014).

Steve Alford is one of 12 head coaches to have led at least four NCAA Division I programs to the NCAA Tournament (Missouri State, Iowa, New Mexico and UCLA). His UCLA teams advanced to the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Tournament in 2014 and 2015. In 2014, he became UCLA's first head coach to lead the Bruins to the Pac-12 Tournament title in his first year as head coach.

The other 11 coaches to have led at least four NCAA Division I teams to the NCAA Tournament include John Beilein, Lefty Driesell, Cliff Ellis, Larry Eustachy, Jim Harrick, Lon Kruger, Fran McCaffery, Tom Penders, Rick Pitino, Tubby Smith and Eddie Sutton. Eight of those 11 coaches are active head coaches.

Of the 12 coaches who have led four different schools to the NCAA Division I Tournament, only five have won at least one game at all four schools. Lon Kruger has won at least one game at five schools.
